- **The Front-Group Shell:** The masked capital populates seemingly independent think tanks, small business coalitions, or legal defense funds. 2. Astroturfing and Fabricated Grassroots Networks

Platforms systematically manufacture fake grassroots support—a practice known as *astroturfing*—to counter regulatory narratives that claim large tech ecosystems crush local businesses.

- **The Small Business Shield:** Shadow-PR networks establish regional associations (e.g., "Main Street App Developers" or "The Digital Freedom Coalition"). 3. "Academic Laundering" and Expert Network Saturation
